


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The turnaround and area traffic

With additional staff onsite, traffic along the plant's entrance will experience heavier flows at certain times. Work schedules have been set to minimize the impact of this traffic.

By early April, lighted, orange traffic flow signs will be placed on Wallisville and Sheldon road to notify travelers. Law enforcement officers will also be along the roadway operating the lights at the Sheldon and Newton and Sheldon and Wallisville intersections.



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
