At Channelview Complex, we produce two of the most essential building blocks in modern manufacturing: **ethylene** and **propylene**. These chemicals may not be household names, but they're behind countless products that touch our lives every day.

Ethylene is used to make polyethylene, the world's most common plastic. It's found in food packaging, medical syringes, water pipes, and even the insulation around electrical wiring. Propylene, a co-product of ethylene production, is used to make polypropylene—another versatile plastic used in everything from car bumpers and carpet backing to clothing fibers and rigid packaging.

Together, these materials support industries that keep our communities running: healthcare, transportation, construction and consumer goods. Whether it's the bottle cap on your drink, the seat cushion in your car, or the container keeping your food fresh, chances are Channelview played a role in making it possible.

By producing high-quality ethylene and propylene, Channelview Complex contributes to safer, more convenient, and more sustainable living. It's a powerful reminder that the work we do isn't just industrial—it's personal. It's about making life better, one molecule at a time.
